



# PRETORIA BOYS HIGH SCHOOL

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## POLICY ON SCHOOL GARMENTS OTHER THAN STANDARD SCHOOL UNIFORM

This policy will apply to all school garments which are not part of the standard summer or winter school uniform. It will become effective immediately.

- **Houses:** Boarding Houses must phase out caps and other non-standard items (excluding house ties) during 2004; they will then be subject to the following regulations, as are the Dayboy Houses:
  - Only House T-shirts and socks are permitted;
  - Any new design for T-shirts must be approved by the Executive and must run for a minimum of 5 years;
  - No house garments may be produced for staff.
- **Sport:** Only PBHS sportswear is permitted. No special practice kit may be designed for /worn by individual teams including 1<sup>st</sup> teams and A-teams. No sport or team may adopt a garment of any description on an *ad hoc* basis for a fixture, festival or season.
- **Clubs & Societies:** Current T-shirts may be retained. Any new designs or requests for garments by clubs and societies that have not previously had these must be approved by the Executive.
- **Form V Group:** Only the matric garment and tie are allowed. No house matric garments are permitted.
- **Touring Groups:** Special clothing may only be acquired if sponsored and if approved by the Executive.
- **General:** Any clothing issue falling outside the scope of the above, must first be referred to the Executive.

### NOTE:

Any garment which is produced without authorization will be banned, irrespective of any costs that have been incurred and/or the involvement of parents or sponsors etc. A garment which is presented to the Executive as a *fait accompli* will not be considered.

Permission must be granted by the Executive before the production of any garments takes place. This means that design or designs must be submitted on paper. Samples of the garment on which the printing or embroidery is to be undertaken, may also be submitted.
