Water Polo Report

Water Polo 2006 was a roller-coaster ride. Highs and lows occurred with startling speed and the season flashed by.

The year started with green pools (again) and although we now seem to have resolved this problem, it was a frustrating start. We once again fielded a large number of teams (eighteen was the most for any one weekend) with a similar number of game plans initially. We attempted to resolve this weakness by regular cross team training sessions and skills training every Monday. The early morning training sessions also improved the strength of our boys and this showed in the water.

I will leave the results to each individual coach but would like to say that while, on the whole, PBHS had a successful season there is definitely room for improvement. To this end a frank meeting was held with all coaches at the end of the season where our weaknesses and areas that needed work across the board were discussed. Particular drills and skills are to be emphasised by all coaches and some specialised equipment will be built or bought to facilitate this. Mr Randall was particularly active in this regard and one of his further innovations was the Junior Water Polo Clinic. This involved primary schools boys from our feeder schools and will hopefully provide an increased pool of talented youngsters in the future.

The senior and junior Inter-House Water Polo festival was an intense and exciting competition. Large numbers of boys turned out as spectators and to play. The junior competition was won by

Rissik while Matheson were victors in the senior competition.

PBHS water polo is a large organisation and I am hugely indebted to those who help me run it. Firstly, Mr Vermeulen (pools) and Mr Housdon (Director of Sport) must be mentioned for their often unseen efforts to enable polo to run smoothly. I would also like to thank all the coaches, both staff and students, who gave up hours of their time to work with their various teams. A special thanks must go to the water polo parents who helped raise funds through their efforts selling bacon and egg rolls and working in the tuckshop. Mrs Erasmus and Mrs Bodenstein and their teams have quietly and efficiently ensured that I had extra funds available for water polo. I used this money for two sets of caps, new netting, weighted balls and have ordered new goals, nets and stretch cords for next year. I also used this money to subsidise various festivals and as capital to secure various bookings, equipment and clothing which is later paid back to the school by individual boys.

Very positive news is that the Headmaster and Governing Body have agreed to heat the water polo pool. This project is under the direction of Mr Mike Godfrey and should be completed early next year.

A final thanks must go to the polo boys. While water polo exists as a sport at this School for the benefit of our boys, it is not something that should be taken for granted. The efforts, trials and tribulations are all made worthwhile when one works with such positive, enthusiastic young men, the vast majority of whom are Boys High boys to their fingertips.
